

The Friends of the Library of West St. Tammany “Lisabeth Millard Scholarship”

The Friends of the Library of West St. Tammany *Lisabeth Millard Scholarship* was established to enhance community knowledge of all resources provided by the library system and to generate a continuing interest in its services.

The total value of the scholarship is \$2000.00 over a continuous four-year period of study and open to graduating high school seniors or equivalent serviced by the Library Districts of St. Tammany Parish. The deadline to apply for this Scholarship is **April 1, 2017**.

Student Qualifications:

1. The applicant must be a graduating high school senior or equivalent serviced by the Library Districts of St. Tammany Parish.
2. The applicant must submit two (2) letters of recommendation, with at least one from a high school teacher, counselor or equivalent.
3. The applicant must be a student eligible for admission into an accredited four (4) year College or University at the time of the posted application deadline.
4. The student must submit an application by the deadline established.

Application Requirements:

1. An essay on how the student has used the public library in the past as well as how this knowledge will assist them during their college education and subsequently in their chosen profession. The essay must be typed and double-spaced on 8-1/2” x 11” paper with a maximum of 500 words. The applicant must sign the essay.
2. An official high school transcript or equal record of academic performance must be submitted. The transcript should include your G.P.A., and rank in class.
3. The applicant must submit two (2) letters of recommendation, with at least one from a high school teacher, counselor or equivalent. Appropriate forms are included for completion.

4. Applications must be **postmarked on or before April 1, 2017**.
